PART 1- SETTING THE STAGE Before Mass Begins

- Find a quiet space to pray this Mass. It's important that you're able to pray authentically during this time.
- Find some holy items to have near your screen, like a cross, candle or picture of a saint.
- Feel free to have a parent or family members pray this Mass with you. Since you're still sheltering at home due to Covid, chances are your family needs to pray just as much as you do too.

PART 4- FINAL REFLECTION AFTER THE MASS How I want to Change

At the end of this Mass, share about your experience by responding to these questions:

After the blessing, the deacon dismisses the people. In fact, the dismissal gives the liturgy its name. The word "Mass" comes from the Latin word, "Missa." At one time, the people were dismissed with the words "Ite, missa est" (literally meaning "Go, she—meaning you, the Church—has been sent"). The word "Missa" is related to the word "missio," the root of the English word "mission." The liturgy does not simply come to an end. Those assembled are sent forth to bring the fruits of the Eucharist to the world.
